

# PROJECT LRRP WORK PLAN

- Project involves work in a house built after 1978, EPA RRP Rule does not apply.
- Project involves work in a house built before 1978 in an addition or renovated area built after 1978, EPA RRP Rule does not apply.
- Project involves work in a house built before 1978, EPA RRP Rule applies.
- This project involves minor cosmetic renovations or repairs in the work area, existing painted surfaces may remain in an undisturbed condition after our work is completed.
- This project involves complete demolition of all finished surfaces in the work area, no existing painted surfaces exist after our work is completed.

## Scenario 1 Assume Everything is Lead Paint. Entire Project is done under LRRP Containment.

- Project is assumed to contain Lead painted surfaces.
- Appropriate RRP containment procedures will be followed in all areas until clearance testing is approved.
- Only painted surfaces needed to perform our work will be removed in accordance with RRP Rule.
- Other workers and sub-contractors will be working inside the containment area during the course of this project. All workers will be required to be trained in accordance with RRP Rule.
- Clearance testing will be performed at the completion of the project.

## Scenario 2 Assume Everything is Lead Paint, COMPLETE removal of painted surfaces, remaining work is cleared of LRRP rule.

- Project is assumed to contain Lead painted surfaces.
- Appropriate RRP containment procedures will be followed in all areas until clearance testing is approved.
- All painted surfaces will be removed in accordance with RRP Rule
- Only trained RRP workers will be involved in the demolition phase
- Clearance testing will be performed at the completion of the demolition phase.

After clearance testing the project will be deemed clear of Lead painted surfaces and other NON-TRAINED sub-contractors and workers will be allowed to proceed under normal working conditions.

## Scenario 3 Test to Identify Lead Paint

- Project will be tested to identify Lead painted surfaces
- Appropriate RRP containment procedures will be followed in the areas needed to remove Lead painted surfaces only.
- Only trained RRP workers will be involved in the removal phase
- All tested and identified Lead paint surfaces will be removed in accordance with RRP Rule
- Clearance testing will be performed after all identified Lead painted surfaces have been removed.

After clearance testing the project will be deemed clear of Lead painted surfaces and other NON-TRAINED sub-contractors and workers will be allowed to proceed under normal working conditions.
